Despite the introduction of various alternative methods of paint application, it is still essential to use paint brushes for many jobs.

Good painting results require the use of quality brushes, and a minimum paint brush kit for home use would be one each of the 4 in., 3 in., 1½ in. and 1 in. widths.

Use the 4 in. size for ceilings, walls and doors. The 3 in. wide brush could also be used for doors in addition to achitraves, skirtings, window sills and similar surfaces. The two smaller sizes are ideal for window sashes and all "cutting in" work around windows cupboards, etc.

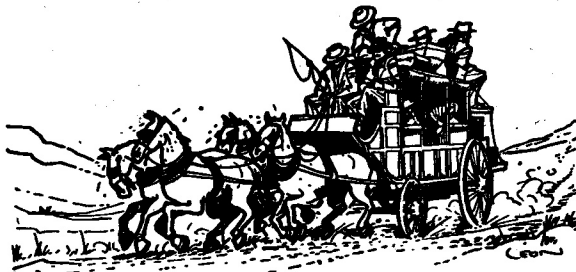
