## Bike Week Exhibition -Our Hidden Cycling History

The club's Bike Week funding application was successful and a number of members have given generously of their time to bring it to fruition.

The exhibition will be open to the public from Monday Feb 29th, with our official opening on Thursday March 3rd.

We've now had two pieces about the exhibition in The West, a reasonable length article in The West Australian on Boxing Day and an outing in the Can You Help? section a couple of weeks ago. Both articles have prompted contact by email and phone from members of the public. One such contact has led to the loan of a bike once owned by Arthur E Hartley for the exhibition. Arthur's is a very interesting story that involves very many turns of the cranks.

5 of the 7 bikes on show have been drawn from members' collections. The 7th bike is Steele Bishop's steed from his successful tilt at a World Championship. It's on loan from the WA Museum collection.

The club has also been gifted an old state jersey and a letter from Hubert Opperman giving training advice to an admirer. Wonderful items, both of which will form part of the show.

This is the club's first multi-day exhibition and it represents a great month long opportunity to raise our profile. We'll continue to send out press releases during March in an effort to get as many people as possible into Perth to see it.

The Museum of Perth is manned when open however it would be wonderful if members were present whenever possible, if you can volunteer some time please let me know.

### Wally Passmore Roach

Geoffrey Worth was a visitor at our February meeting. He saw the Can You Help piece in The West Australian recently and while he couldn't shed any light on the Ken Bugden story he shared with us the research he's been doing on his great great uncle;

My late Great Great Uncle Wallie Passmore Roach (he was my grandmothers brother) was a very good cyclist in WA before he enlisted with the 11th Battalion and went off to war at Gallipoli and was killed in action on the first day, 25th April 1915, at the age of 21.

Through my Grand Parents and Parents, I am now in possession of his cycling medals and also his postcard albums that also contain postcards of his cycling days.

I believe from the information I have obtained that he ran the cycle shop in Steere street in Collie before going off to war. His father was very well known within the Guildford community.

## **Gary Wiggins**

Gary Wright was inspired to write to remind us that 2012 Tour de France winner Bradley Wiggins' father Gary won the Griffin 1000 in WA in 1985. The Griffin 1000 was a seven day stage race that covered 1000km between Perth and Manjimup.

Gary Wiggins was an Australian, born in Victoria, who moved to the UK in his early twenties, racing on the Continent for almost a decade.

Estranged from his second wife Gary returned to Australia after an accident in 1987 and died in 2008 following a fall after a fight at a party.
