Mal Buckland gave an interesting talk on Nickel Plating. He GUEST SPEAKER warned that this can be a hot and lengthy procedure and that preparation before plating is essential. The plating kit cost about \$150, the actual plating takes about two hours but it is necessary to keep the temperature between 50 & 60 degrees C and make up for evaporation losses. The whole process is hard work.

SHOW& TELL Peter wells had a box of bits, and was open to offers. Mal Bell showed a 1961 Humber in excellent condition, complete with tools and saddle bag. Merv Thompson showed a Norman ladies bike of about 1945 vintage (not sure if that is the Norman lady or the bike ED) which he has recently restored. Audax is a group of organizations all over the World for riders who enjoy pushing themselves to the limit on long distance as a group. This year the WA Audax people organ0ized a two day ride from Perth to Albany and return, and had entrants from Asia, USA, Europe, and of course Australia. Our club was invited to put on a small display on the beautiful grounds near the Mends St. jetty in South Perth. Apart from a few hiccups on where we were supposed to be, we soon had a small but pretty comprehensive display on view for the many passing pedestrians and cyclists of all ages as well as proud mums showing off their little ones-the weather was perfect. Our display covered from the 1880s to the mid 1960s, but looked a little outdated when the Audax boys and girls turned up with their state of the art creations. Original paint. Possibly late 1950s Worth looking at. Complete bike


Gents 23 inch frame with Sa 3 speed gears. Complete fair condition
